

Security Committee Meeting  
June 7, 2008

Call to order by Jim Evans @ 9:30AM

Andy Gross, Security Chief, reports that the village is experiencing an increase in bear activity in the village and they are scattering trash bins. All residents are encouraged to properly store their trash and garbage in trash cans and bear bins.

The Security staff has increased it traffic enforcement efforts within the village, writing 92 warnings for the month. With the warm weather upon us and more children walking and playing, the Rangers want to keep a good reign on keeping our village safe and secure.

There were four minor motor vehicle accidents in the village in May, fortunately no one was injured. One accident involved an ATV rider running a dog on a long leash resulting in the injury of a pedestrian. The Security Committee reviewed a proposed amendment to the rules and regulations to prohibit this type of activity in the future.

Security is installing additional security cameras in the village. The existing cameras have proven to be an asset to the security staff and have decreased vandalism and mischief within the village.

Charlene Skipper advised the committee that the CPR-defibrillator training will be scheduled in July and will be instructed by Thornhurst Ambulance Squad. All residents are welcome and encouraged to sign up at the office. The village currently owns (4) defibrillators. 2 are in the on-duty Ranger vehicles, one is in the office and one in the chalet. CPR is a valuable skill that everyone should know! Check the calendar for the date.

The 4<sup>th</sup> annual ATV rally is scheduled for August 16<sup>th</sup> immediately following the Board meeting. Every resident that owns an ATV is encouraged to attend. The rally begins with a safety meeting and ATV safety inspection. There will be prizes and giveaways and we have a special “surprise” for our riders.
