

LOCUST LAKES VILLAGE LAKES AND WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE
MEETING MINUTES, MAY15 2008

Meeting opened at 6:45 PM via motion by Dee Kasarda, 2nd by Joe McFadden.
Unanimous approval.

Members in attendance: Bob Wolek, Andy Gross, Joe McFadden, Dee Kasarda, Ken DeVito, Sean Wren and Ron Gatti.

Committee/issue Updates:

Ron Gatti's Report on Status of the Pines Lake Overflow Structure replacement.

" Progress over the winter months has been in the hands of Fred Spot and Locust Ridge Quarry. It was necessary to get new specifications approved via DEP. "This was necessitated since the original approvals were rescinded by DEP upon notification from Fred Spot that the current structure was not manufactured/installed according to approved plans. We have a 2/25/08 letter from DEP documenting the removal of approval,

" The new structure is being fabricated by Modern Septic. Upon completion a two week curing time is required," " Fred Spot is to supervise the installation of the new structure " This is stated as a recommendation in the referenced DEP letter.

Ron expressed concern about the unknown time frame for installation/completion of this project and stated we might consider postponing completion until after Labor Day. Our committee members had many questions, which were unanswerable at this time. We recommended and Ron agreed that another meeting with Fred Spot, the Quarry, and our committee should be convened ASAP in order to obtain answers to outstanding questions and to determine the schedule for completion.

Deer Management Report. Andy Gross.

LLV participates in the Pa. Game Commission DMAP PROGRAM. We have 4 designated DMAP areas in the Village. They are located in the Tower area, behind the Tennis Courts, Near the back Ball Field and off of Beaver Run. The Game commission has issued our village 50 coupons. We issued 28 of those to licensed and approved harvesters. The current deer herd has been thinned by 10 as a result of this program with 5 being taken from behind the Tennis courts, 4 from Beaver Run and 1 from the Ball field area.

Goose Management Report .Dee Kasarda.

Dee reports that we have an "egg culling permit " and as of this date 1 nest with 3 eggs has been spotted and is being processed. The goose management program is underway with the objective being to eliminate or minimize the effects of these geese on our Lakes and beaches.

Fishing Club Report. Bob Wolek.

Bob reported that 2850 lbs of trout have been released into Locust and East Lakes. There was a stocking prior to opening of this years fishing season, an additional stocking last week, and there will be an additional stocking next week prior to the Kids fishing contest.

Discussions were held regarding the quality of our lakes waters, the presence of algae, and the coming treatment of our Lakes by Aquatic Environmental Services.

Ron Gatti agreed to contact Bill Kirkpatrick of AES and ask him to attend a future meeting of our committee here in LLV in order for us to further understand his companies lake water management programs.

Open Discussion.

Satellite Dishes. The question was raised, once again, regarding home owners placing Satellite Dishes on common property around Pines Lake. Currently there is no permit required and therefore the potential exists for large, unsightly dishes being installed. A permit process is recommended with restrictions on size and locations specified.

Boat Registrations.

Members of our committee object to the 150% increase in the boat registration fees and consider it to be excessive and unreasonable.

Motion by Dee Kasarda, 2nd by Sean Wren. Unanimous Approval.

" That the LLV Board of Directors " readdress and reassess the recently enacted boat registration fees."
